4. Set up an organisational structure with partners

Potential partners with relevant competences, tools and information must be identified and cooperation with them must be sought and coordinated.



5. Ensure a strong information position

By putting together the different pieces of information that different partners have, it is possible to achieve a richer intelligence picture.



6. Set up joint actions on the ground

A multidisciplinary cooperation is not limited to a joint strategy or the sharing of information, but it is also important to set up coordinated joint inspection.
